No. 9-1/2021-TS.III dated 31.08.2021 the Ministry has directed that the backlog vacancies in respect of SC/ST, OBC and EWS may be filled up immediately and other vacancies may be filled up once consolidated guidelines, as per the CEI Act, 2019, are issued by the Ministry.

The Board noted that the Institute has advertised the vacancies at the level of Assistant Professor (Assistant Professor (Grade-II) in Academic Level 10 /11 (on contract) and Assistant Professor (Grade-I) in Academic Level 12] in various departments of the Institute vide advertisement No. 02/2022 dated 24.05.2022 and the process of the same has been completed.

Further, institute has also advertised the vacant faculty positions at the level of Assistant Professor [Assistant Professor (Grade-II) in Academic Level 10 /11 (on contract) and Assistant Professor (Grade-I) in Academic Level 12], Associate Professor (Level 13) and Professor (Level 14A) in various departments of the Institute vide Rolling Advertisement No. 05/2022 dated 16.12.2022 to further suppress the vacancies. This rolling advertisement will be an ongoing recruitment process for all positions.

The Board took a note of the category wise details of the faculty positions sanctioned, in-position, vacant and advertised as at ANNEXURE-II.

The Board also noted that the Ministry of Education vide email dated 03.10.2022 regarding Mission Recruitment – Filling up the vacancies in Mission Mode has provided

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
the schedule for filling the vacancies and the Institute will follow the same schedule for filling up the vacancies.


The Board advised the Institute to make all possible efforts to fill the vacant faculty positions and minimize the vacancies, on priority.

To consider the request made by Prof. Nand Kishor, Professor, Department of Electrical Engineering for grant of extension of Extra Ordinary Leave for the period of one (01) year to join Ostfold University College, Norway.

Resolution

The Board of Governors considered the request made by Prof. Nand Kishor, Professor, Department of Electrical Engineering for grant of extension of Extra Ordinary Leave for the period of one (01) year to join Ostfold University College, Norway.

The Board of Governors was apprised with the following details in the matter:

- (I) Dr. Nand Kishor, Professor, Department of Electrical Engineering is an employee of this Institute since 07.06.2006 and at present he is working on the post of Professor in the Department of Electrical Engineering in PB-4 AGP 10500 /- since 17.08.2018.
- (ii) Dr. Kishor with the permission of the Board of Governors of the Institute was granted one year Extra Ordinary Leave w.e.f. 10.07.2021 to join the Ostfold University College, Norway as Professor. Dr. Nand Kishor has also executed the Service Bond for the said period as per guidelines of grant of Extra Ordinary Leave approved by the Board of Governors.
- (iii) Dr. Nand Kishor vide e-mail dated 06.05.2022 has informed that initially he was offered temporary position in the said university and after completion of one year of service the said university has offered him permanent position. Further, Dr. Nand Kishor has requested to consider the extension of Extra Ordinary Leave for further period of one(01) year w.e.f 11.07.2022.
- (iv) As per directive/Rules approved by the Board of Governors for granting the Extra Ordinary Leave for employee who are allowed to take up foreign assignments/ study leave on Extra Ordinary Leave entails that:
 - (a) An employee will be eligible to avail a maximum of 5 years of Extra Ordinary Leave, without pay and allowance, during the entire period of service.

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- (b) An employee will be eligible for Extra Ordinary Leave at the rate of one year for every 5 years of service put in at this Institute except for higher studies leading to the award of a degree.
- (v) Dr. Nand Kishore has already exhausted the Extra Ordinary leave he is eligible for viz-a-viz service rendered by him in the Institute therefore, his request of extension of EOL was denied and asked to join the department otherwise it will be considered absent from duty. But, Dr. Nand Kishore has still not reported back to the services of Institute.
- (vi) The extant of Rules 25 of the CCS(Leave) Rules, 1972 provides as under: "The said provision addresses the situation where an employee overstays beyond the sanctioned leave for the kind due and admissible, and the competent authority has not approved such extension. The consequences that flow from such refusal of extension of leave include that:
 - The Government servant shall not be entitled to any leave salary for such absence:
 - ii. The period shall be debited against his leave account as though it were half pay leave to the extent such leave is due, the period excess of such leave due being treated as extraordinary leave.
 - iii. Wilful absence from duty after expiry of leave renders a Government servent liable to disciplinary action.

With respect to (iii) above, it may be stated that all Ministries/Departments are requested to ensure that in all cases of unauthorized absence by a Government servant, he should be informed of the consequences of such absence and be directed to rejoin duty immediately/within a specified period, say within three days, failing which he would be liable for disciplinary action under CCS(CCA) Rules, 1965."

(vii) As per First Statutes under NIT Act-2007 appointing authority in the Institute is Board of Governors, therefore the power of any Disciplinary action is vested under Board of Governors of the Institute as a Disciplinary Authority.

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The Board of Governors in consideration of the above, resolved to recommend that since Dr. Nand Kishore has already exhausted the Extra Ordinary leave he is eligible for viz-a-viz service rendered by him in the Institute, his request of extension of EOL was denied and he may be asked to join the department. In case, he doesn't report back to the institute within February 28, 2023, the services of Dr. Nand Kishore will be terminated with payment of all dues (if any) considering the same as deemed resignation.

The Board of Governors noted that as per the Recruitment Rules (2019) for Non-teaching Staff of NITs the Recruitment Rules for the positions of Nurses is not available. Therefore, Institute requires the Recruitment Rules for the appointment of such Nursing Staff.

The Board of Governors was apprised that the Institute Health Centre is having Full time Medical Officer, Part-time Doctor's and Specialist Doctors to provide the primary Health Services, the First-aid in case of the emergency etc. However, at present the Institute Health Centre is not having any Nursing Staff to assist the Doctor's.

The Board of Governors in consideration of the Institute requirement agreed in principle with the Institute proposal. However, for the Recruitment Rules and deciding other modalities of recruitment the Board of Governors resolved to recommend that the matter may be referred to the Ministry of Education for making uniform Recruitment Rules/policy for such positions across all NITs and the positions proposed by the Institute may be kept at abeyance for recruitment in near future. For running the dispensary smoothly, contractual staff may be

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engaged for the time being till realization of recruitment policy of nursing staff across all NITs.

The Building and Works Committee further acknowledged and appreciated the contributions made by Prof. A. K. Sachan & Mr. P. D. Mishra as Members and Dr. Sarvesh K. Tiwari as Registrar & Member Secretary of the Building and Works Committee, MNNIT Allahabad.

The Building and Works Committee deliberated on the Agenda items, and agenda item-wise proceedings are as under:

Item No. 38.01

: To confirm the minutes of the Thirty-seventh [37th] meeting of the Building and Works Committee of MNNIT Allahabad held on 31.08.2022 at MNNIT Allahabad.

Resolution

: The Building and Works Committee considered the confirmation of minutes of its Thirty-seventh [37th] meeting held on 31.08.2022, and noted that no comments have been received from any of the members.

The Building and Works Committee, considering the above, confirmed the minutes of its Thirty-seventh [37th] meeting held on 31.08.2022, as circulated.

Item No. 38.02

To report the action taken on the resolutions of the Thirty-seventh [37th] meeting of the Building and Works Committee of MNNIT Allahabad held on 31.08.2022 at MNNIT Allahabad.

Resolution

: The Building and Works Committee perused the action taken by the Institute on the decisions taken in its Thirty-seventh [37th] meeting held on 31.08.2022, as circulated along with agenda papers.

The Building and Works Committee resolved that action taken by the Institute on the decisions taken in its Thirty-seventh [37th] meeting be noted and taken on record.

Item No. 38.03

[A] To review the status of on-going construction /infrastructure works being undertaken by CPWD in the Institute.

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[B] To consider the report of Sixth [6th] meeting of the Project Monitoring Group [PMG] of the Institute held on 16.11.2022.

Resolution

[A] Representatives of the CPWD made presentation before the Building and Works Committee during the meeting, and apprised the Building and Works Committee about the current status of ongoing construction works being undertaken by them in the Institute campus.

The Building and Works Committee while considering the status of ongoing works presented by the CPWD Allahabad, observed the following:

- (A) The members of the Building and Works Committee expressed their displeasure on excessive delay in work as well as the workmanship / quality of work executed by contractors of ongoing Infrastructure projects of Boys Hostel and Multi-Storied Faculty Quarters.
- (B) The progress of both the ongoing projects presently being undertaken by the CPWD is very slow and is not as per the time schedule given by the CPWD earlier. It has been communicated to CPWD multiple times but there seems to be no significant improvement in the progress of the work. The representatives of the CPWD may be informed that the delay in projects is not from the Institute side, and therefore, the same will be attributable to the CPWD only with applicable penalty as per the MoU/ Contract Agreement.
- (C) The Building and Works Committee also desired that the CPWD may be asked to provide the delay report from the start of the work to till date to the Institute.
- (D) The Building and Works Committee noted the suggestions of one of the member of the Building and Works Committee that for the effective monitoring of the work progress of both the ongoing

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Infrastructure projects the CPWD and Institute Engineers may quantify the work as per module and prepare activity wise list with proposed period of time to complete the same, so that their progress can be monitored at the micro level for the given time frame. BWC expressed its doubt over the new date of completion proposed by the CPWD because current status report is not very appealing.

- (E) The Building and Works Committee desired that the CPWD and the Institute Engineers shall ensure that there is no change in the AA & ES of the work. Also, they may be advised that in all future work, all the scope of works may be included in PE itself and no changes in PE will be allowed.
- (F) The Institute Engineers shall ensure that various NOCs from the respective authorities including the NOC from the Fire Department has been taken and in case such NOCs are issued by imposing certain conditions, then these conditions must have been taken care of and duly complied, with and a Compliance Report of the same to be submitted to the Institute.
- (G) The Building and Works Committee considered the Third Party Inspection reports done by the IIT BHU for both the ongoing projects submitted by the CPWD and resolved that before taking over of both the projects, an inspection by the other Third party, independently, decided by the MNNIT Allahabad should be done at site and their observations will be compiled and accordingly all rectifications will be done by the CPWD before taking over both the projects.

The expenditure for the same may be booked under the sanctioned AA/ES of both the subject woks.

The Building and Works Committee also observed and noted the following in respect of ongoing projects being undertaken by the CPWD:

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Construction of Boys Hostel:

The Building and Works Committee noted the revised completion date of the whole project (Block A, Block B, Block C and Kitchen Block) including the furniture & kitchen accessories work with proper cleaning is 28.02.2023 as intimated by the Executive Engineer during the meeting. Executive Engineer will also be asked to give demonstration of working of all installed kitchen equipment's for the automation of kitchen. Executive Engineer of the CPWD has also assured that no further extension will be required beyond this revised date.

Construction of Multi-Storied Faculty Quarters (G+12):

The Building and Works Committee noted the revised completion date of the project including the kitchen accessories work with proper cleaning is 28.02.2023 as intimated by the Executive Engineer during the meeting. Executive Engineer of the CPWD has also assured that no further extension will be required beyond this revised date but Institute still have doubt over this date also keeping the past performance of CPWD in mind.

The Building and Works Committee resolved that the presentation given by the CPWD may be taken on record for future reference to avoid any legal issues.

[B] The Building and Works Committee considered the recommendations of the Sixth [6th] meeting of the Project Monitoring Group [PMG] held on 16.11.2022 to plan for separate tender for all other external development works (road work, replacement of damage water supply pipeline, cable, boring etc.) required or related to the project at the site of Multi Faculty Quarters.

The Building and Works Committee noted that the above external development works required or related to the project at the site of Multi-Storied Faculty Quarters (G+12) may be executed through the CPWD within the sanctioned amount (AA/ES) of Rs.39,66,42,400.00 of the

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subject work and the same will be put up for rectification in the next BWC meeting.

Resolution

: The Building and Works Committee considered the proposal for engaging a Public Sector Undertakings set up by the Central or State Government to carry out Civil & Electrical Works or to Central/ State Government organizations / PSUs notified by the Ministry of Urban Development (MoUD) as per the provisions of Rule 133(3) for executing the Civil/ Electrical Infrastructure Work (Repair & Original Work).

The Building and Works Committee was apprised the following:

- (i) As per the decision of the Building and Works Committee in its Thirty-seventh [37th] meeting held on 31.08.22 vide item No. 37.05, the Institute has prepared a draft Request for Proposal [RFP] for appointment of Central Public Sector Undertaking (CPSU) as a Project Management Consultant [PMC] at MNNIT Allahabad, Prayagraj as per the procedures adopted by the IIT Delhi, NIT Delhi and other NITs for shortlisting the PSUs in accordance with the notified instructions for appointment of Central Public Sector Undertaking (CPSU) by the Ministry of Urban Development (MoUD) or State Govt. PSU, listed in the stock exchange.
- (ii) Accordingly, Institute has published the Notice No. 296/CWM/2022-23 dated 20.10.2022 for the invitation of the Request for Proposal [RFP]on 21.10.2022.

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- (iii) Institute has also given reply to all the queries raised/ seeked by various agencies interested in applying for the said Request for Proposal [RFP].
- (iv) In reference to above, Evaluation Committee [Civil & Electrical Works Maintenance (New Infrastructure Projects) Committee] constituted vide notification no: CWM/2022-23/331 dated 10.11.2022 found that the following five firms had submitted their proposal against the subject Request for Proposal (RFP):

(v) After scrutiny, Evaluation Committee found that only two Firms, NBCC (INDIA) LIMITED and M/s RITES LIMITED are listed in the Stock Exchange and only one firm, NBCC (INDIA) LIMITED are notified by the Ministry of Urban Development (MoUD) among the above mentioned participants.

Evaluation Committee considered the subject matter in its meeting held on 08.12.2022 and after detailed discussion on this, recommended that as M/s RITES LIMITED has just satisfactorily completed the work of construction of Girls Hostel in the Institute Campus, therefore M/s RITES LIMITED may be provided opportunity for presentation by relaxing the notification under the Ministry of Urban Development and accordingly made final recommendation that M/s RITES Ltd. and NBCC (INDIA) LIMITED may be called for the presentation as mentioned in the clause 18 (B) of the subject Request of Proposal (RFP).

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- (vi) Accordingly, M/s RITES Ltd. and NBCC (INDIA) LIMITED was called on 13.12.2022 at MNNIT Allahabad for giving the presentation for evaluation of Technical Bid per clause 18 (B) of the subject Request of Proposal (RFP) before the members of the Evaluation Committee and Project Monitoring Group [PMG] Committee.
- (vii) Further, Evaluation Committee considered the evaluation sheet of Technical bid submitted by the M/s RITES Ltd. and NBCC (INDIA) Ltd. recommended by the members of the PMG Committee and evaluation committee in the 7th meeting of the PMG committee.

As per evaluation of technical bid, it is found that that NBCC (INDIA) LTD. has scored 97 % technical score (TS) and M/s RITES LTD. has scored 80% technical score (TS).

Evaluation Committee recommended that both the firms are technically qualified and also recommended to open the financial bid of both the firms on 13.12.2022 at MNNIT Allahabad.

(viii) Accordingly, the financial bid was opened on 13.12.2022 for calculation of Composite score (S) for each bidder as per clause 20 of the RFP for award of the contract. The details of both the firms are as follows:
